



659260 Sizzix® Thinlits™ Die - Flower, Gerber Daisy by Susan Tierney-Cockburn




1. Die-cut 3-4 petals from red, pink, orange or yellow cardstock. Die-cut the leaves and calyx (Flower base) from medium to dark green cardstock, the two large stamens in same shade or slightly darker than main flower, and 4 small stamens in a contrasting shade of cardstock.



2. Place each group of petals on the Molding Pad, right side down, and use the 3mm Loop Tool to **shape** each petal, starting from the outer edge to the center. **Pinch** every petal in each group of petals.



3. **Cup** each group of petals using the 3mm Ball Stylus. Use a toothpick to apply adhesive to the back side of the petals. Glue the groups of petals together in a stack with the petals alternating.



4. Using scissors, cut each projection of each stamen in half. **Stir** large calyx using 3mm Ball Stylus. **Cup** small calyx with 2mm Ball Stylus. Use a toothpick to apply a small amount of glue to the underside of the larger stamen and place on top of the other large stamen. Repeat with the smaller stamens.



5. Use a toothpick to apply a small amount of glue around the projection tips of large and small stamen stacks. Sprinkle both with Woodland Scenics™ Pollen (color will depend on the variety of flower you're making). Glue the small stamen stack inside the large stack. Glue the stamens into the center of the flower and apply a bead of color using Viva Decor Paper Pen in black, Moss Green, depending on the shade of your flower.



6. **Stem, vein, pinch and bend** leaves. Back fold leaves along the stem line and apply FanPaste!™ Bright Green to the raised fold. Reverse the fold of the leaf so that highlighted stem line is the inner fold. Dip and drag stem in glue and place beneath the flower.
