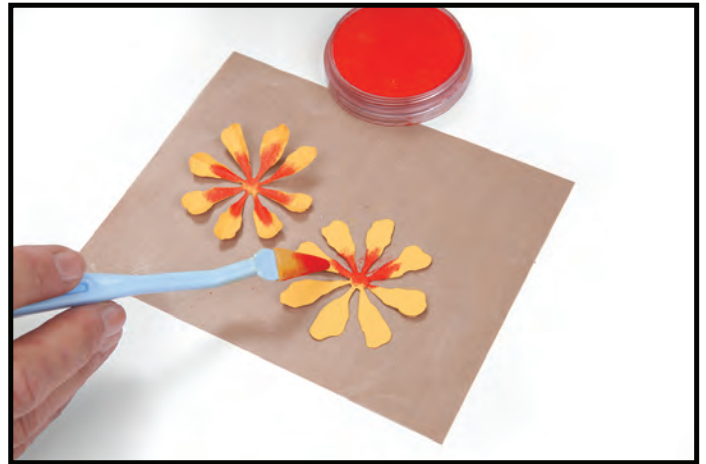


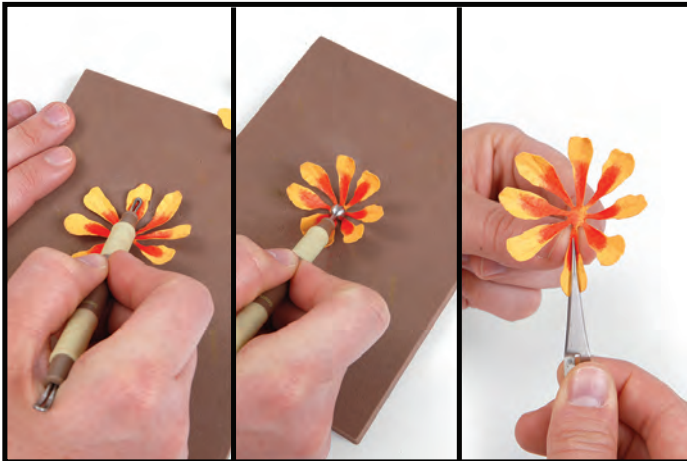
659265 Sizzix® Thinlits™ Die - Flower, Zinnia by Susan Tierney-Cockburn



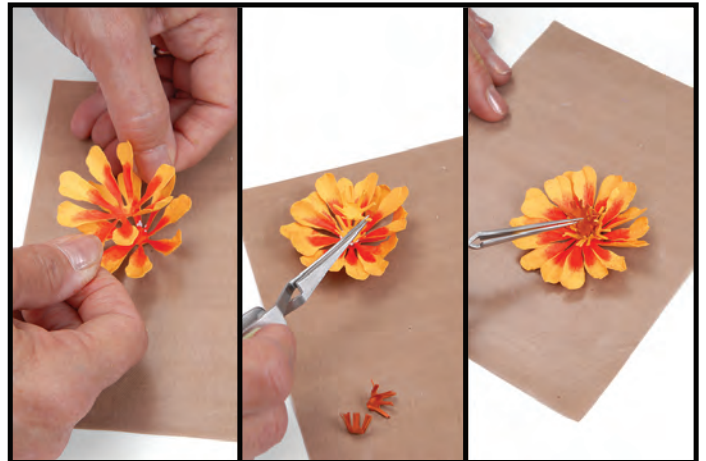
1. Die-cut two petals from yellow, orange, red, pink, blue, purple or white cardstock. Die-cut four to six leaves from bright to medium green cardstock, the flowerlets from bright yellow, two large stamens from yellow and the small stamens from orange or rust.



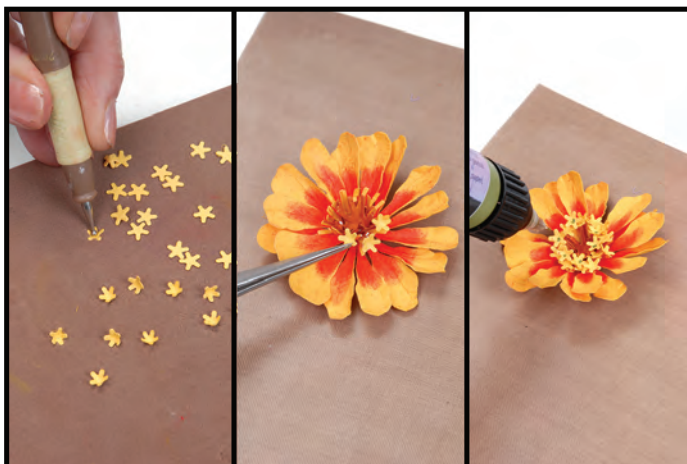
2. Use PanPastel™ colors to shade the Flower shape (reference gardening magazine for inspiration).



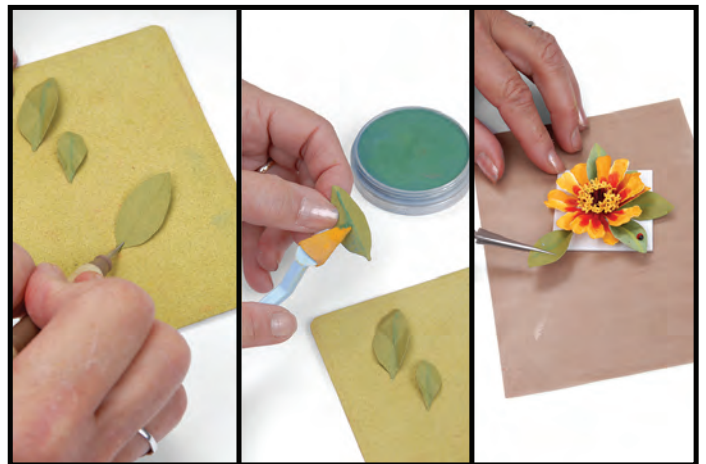
3. Place each group of petals on the Molding Pad and use the 3mm Loop Tool to **shape** each petal, starting from the outer edge to the center. **Cup** each group of petals using the 3mm Ball Stylus. **Pinch** every petal in each group of petals.



4. Use a toothpick to apply adhesive to the back side of the petals. Glue the groups of petals together in a stack with the petals alternating. Use scissors to split each projection of both the large and small stamens. Use the 3mm Ball Stylus to stir or cup the stamens. Stack and glue the stamens together as shown.



5. Place the flowerlets on the Molding Pad and cup using the 2mm Ball Stylus. Use tweezers to pick up the flowerlets and apply a small amount of glue using a toothpick. Set in place around the stamen projections. Add beads of color in the center of each flowerlet using a dark green Viva Decor Paper Pen.



6. **Stem, vein, pinch and bend** leaves. Backfold leaves along the stem line and apply PanPastel colors to highlight the raised fold. Reverse the fold of the leaf so that highlighted stem line is the inner fold. Dip and drag stem in glue and place beneath the Flower.
