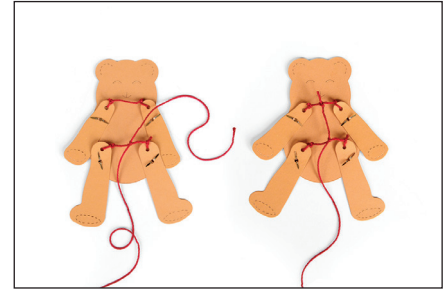

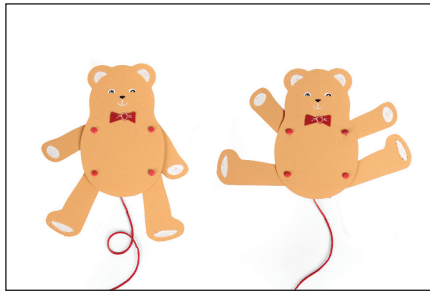

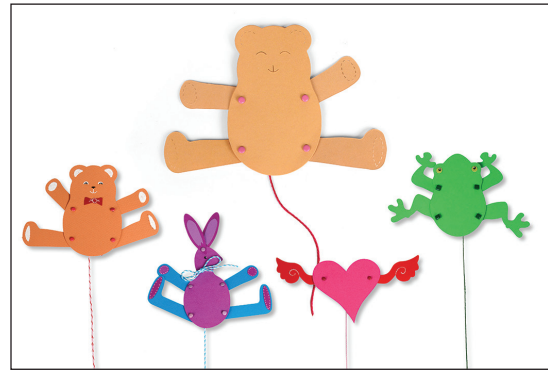

The teacher will die-cut the materials for student use prior to the lesson.

1. Die-cut the animal and heart pieces from construction paper or cardstock. Students can embellish the animals and heart with crayons or markers or by layering with colored paper pieces (Figures A & E).
2. Attach the arms and legs with tiny brads through the inner holes. Position the arms and legs in the down position, and tie them together (in the back) with a piece of twine or string that is knotted through the outside holes (Figure B).
3. Cut a 12" length of twine or string, and lay it down the middle of the arms and legs (on the back side). Tie a knot to secure the middle string to the legs and then the arm strings as shown (Figure C).

NOTE: Hold the figure from the top and pull on the middle string to cause the arms and legs to jump (Figure D).
